Which one is right for you?

Many students and parents begin the college prep process by comparing the ACT and SAT tests. The <u>SAT</u> and <u>ACT</u> generally cover the same topics. Both ACT and SAT scores are used for college admissions decisions and awarding merit-based scholarships. Most colleges do not prefer one test over the other.
